Building Blocks Project Work Requirements

On Achievement Day, Building Block project members will be required to display **three (3)** projects. Members are encouraged to select projects that are suited to their abilities, their age and the time they have available to do the work. Members can choose to do two items from the same section in the 4-H Nova Scotia Provincial Show Class List; however, the second one must show some advancement in learning and techniques over the first one.

4-H NOVA SCOTIA PROVINCIAL SHOW CLASS & SECTIONS:

Each county is eligible to send the **top two junior** and **top two senior** Building Block project articles to the 4-H Nova Scotia Provincial Show. The sections are as follows:

CLASS #22: BUILDING BLOCKS

SECTION 1:	Buildings
SECTION 2:	Vehicles (any type of vehicle, not including power functions)
SECTION 3:	Scene (park, lake, forest, other)
SECTION 4:	Utility (picture frames, pencil holders, other)
SECTION 5:	Stop motion animation
SECTION 6:	Specialty item (design your own kit, items including power functions, posters, other)

NOTE: any interlocking building blocks can be used. Purchased building block kit designs are not permitted to be used as 4-H projects.

Building Blocks competition guidelines

Each county may select one junior and one senior member to compete at 4-H Nova Scotia Show.

All supplies for the competition will be provided.

Members will be given a theme or topic and will have 50 minutes to complete their design. Judging will be based on creativity, use of theme/topic, and construction/sturdiness of design.

NOTE: members do not take home the article they create in the building blocks competition.
