## Printable Worksheet – Garden Journal



New gardeners can learn a lot about when and where to plant from other local gardeners, books and online. However, each location will have its own micro-climate depending on elevation, slope, soil conditions, and sun exposure. For this reason, many gardeners keep a journal to record how plants grow in their own garden. This can be useful year to year as you decide where to plant (crops should be rotated annually in the garden plot) and when to start seeds.

Use this space to sketch your garden. For example, you can add rows and label the type of plant grown in each row. If you are growing in containers list what type of plant is in each container.
