### Activity Ideas

#### Activity #1:

Plan a game, such as a trivia challenge with different goat breeds and their characteristics or a word search with different goat terminology.

#### Activity #2:

Create a diagram/quiz on the body parts of a goat.

#### Activity 3#: What would you do?

This activity focuses on sportsmanship in and outside the ring. Present scenarios to members and ask them what they would do in that situation. Focus on the values and teachings of the 4-H program and the responsibility of representing the clover. Below are some examples of scenarios:

- You placed third in your showmanship class after having been switched from first down to third. You are not happy about your results. What next?
- You and a group of friends are chatting after the show. Popular opinion says that the person whose goat won should not have. Everyone has a lot of negative things to say about the animal and the exhibitor because she appears to not do a lot of the work on her own. What do you do?
- Your parent is really upset about how you placed in showmanship at a show and thinks that the judge did a terrible job. They intend to have a heated discussion with the judge. What do you do?
